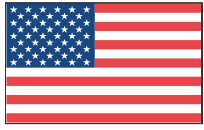

American Literature

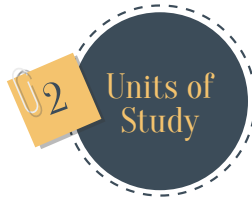


Through the study of American texts, students will become more proficient in the four areas of literacy: reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

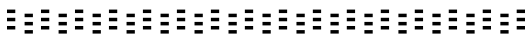

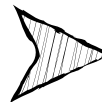


Turning in Work

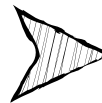
